LEFTOVER RELIGION

I read somewhere of a strange custom found among natives in the New Hebrides Islands in the South Pacific. They prepare a feast with pig as the main entrée. They devour the entire pig except for it's tail. After the feast they offer the tail as a sacrifice to their god. Their god must be content with leftovers. However, it occurs to me that this is not really so different from what a lot of people think 'Christianity' is all about. Like the islanders of New Hebrides they are content to give God their leftovers. We can see this happening in a number of ways...

Some give what is left of their loyalty. Jesus taught that God must come first in life. (Matt 6:33) But many people place God way down on their list of priorities. They are more loyal to their job, or family, or friends, or favorite ball team than they are to their creator.

Some give what is left of their time. Next to our soul, time is the most precious possession we have. Benjamin Franklin said that time is "the stuff life is made of." We are commanded to redeem the time because the days are evil. (Eph 5:16) But so often, we are content to give God what little time we have left over from our jobs, hobbies, TV and other pursuits and pleasures. We give God an hour or two a week and squander the rest on ourselves.

Some give what is left of their money. After taking out the car payment, utilities, grocery money, entertainment allowance, etc., etc. They grudgingly give whatever is left (if anything) to God. Giving to God ought to come first! Paul commanded, "let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him," (1 Cor. 16:2) and also admonished "let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:70. Instead, we too often spend our money on material possessions: Forty thousand for a brand new car. Twenty thousand for a piece of land. Two hundred thousand to purchase a house. Ten dollars to God.

Some give what is left of their lives. Some have concluded that religion is for old folks. While they are young they intend to eat drink and be merry - sow a few wild oats. And then they plan to turn to God after they've had their fun - they'll give Him the empty worn- out shell of a wasted life! The wise man counsels: "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth, while the evil days come not, nor the years draw nigh, when thou shalt say, I have no pleasure in them." (Eccl. 12:1)

God deserves far more than our left-overs. He will never be satisfied with our crumbs. Only our best and finest will do. Is he getting that from you?
